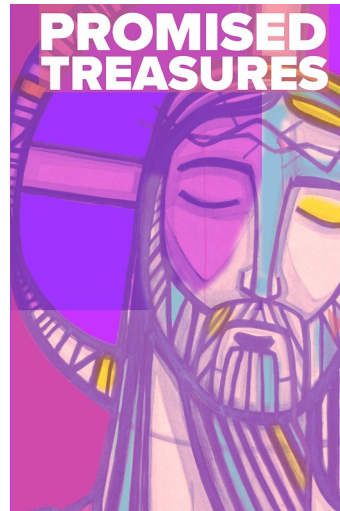

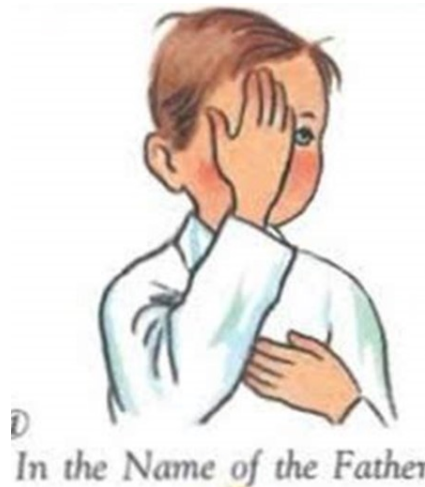
You Are a Model, God is Your Model

As I laid my hands on the head of my 16-month-old son on Ash Wednesday and announced to him, “In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins” he looked up at me and smiled. As I concluded with “in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit” he took his own hand and moved from his chin to his belly button and then horizontally across his chest. If he had a pen, or crayon, in his hand the marks he would have made would have probably looked more like a squiggly mess than the actual sign of the cross, but the fact that he was trying to do the thing that he sees mom and dad, and big brothers and sisters doing all the time reminded me of the model we set for our children.

God has placed us in the lives of those we know, our church family, and everyone who could be considered our neighbor, for a purpose. We’re told in Matthew 5 that we are salt and light to the world. What others see in us is the reflection of the light of Christ and the seasoning that He has given us to share with the world. And to other Christians, we are a model of how Christ has called us to be His people both within, and outside of, the church. The point is not that we all need to be teaching our children to make the sign of the cross (although this is a good and salutary practice). Or that everyone’s practice, in church or at home, needs to look exactly the same (it doesn’t). The point is that others, children and adults, will look to you as a model. Paul reminds us of the importance of the model we set for others when he says to the church in Ephesus, “Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.” (Eph. 5:1-2)

The only way we are able to imitate our God who created, redeemed, and sanctifies us is to rely on the grace He so freely gives. During this Lenten season we have a fresh opportunity to embrace this amazing love God gives to us, His children, in new ways. St. Paul clearly states that “faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ” (Rom. 10:17), but the Gospel is also communicated through the rest of our senses as well. Each Wednesday during Lent we will take a journey to concretely see, smell, touch and taste a number of biblical elements. Our theme is *Promised Treasures*, and just as Israel wandered the wilderness for forty years with Moses as they awaited the Promised Land, we await heaven in the wilderness of this life. We know that life as exiles in the wilderness of this world is not easy or pain free. We await our real home, the new promised land of heaven and until we enter that land the Lord calls us to be light in this dark world. He calls us to be imitators of Himself and models for others of the lives He calls His children to. This is what it means to be created in His image and called according to His purpose. (Genesis 1:27; Romans 8:28)

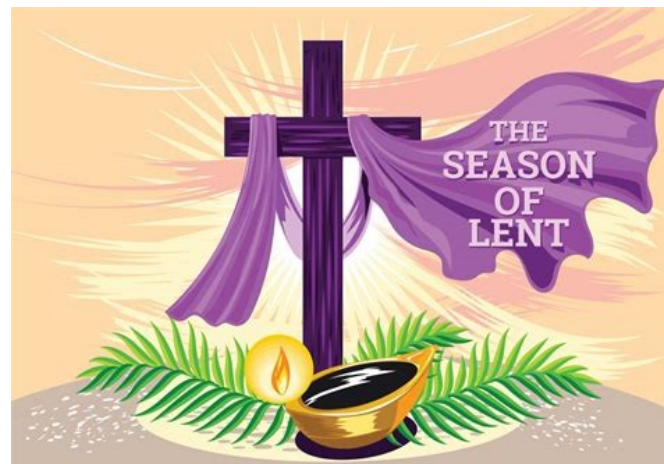
