TRADITIONS ARE IMPORTANT


As the month of October comes to a close and November begins, we enter into an incredibly busy and important time in the church. Of course, all seasons are important, but November brings a close to the church year and also the season of Thanksgiving. December begins the new church year with Advent, ushering in the season of Christmas. With all this activity comes the traditions that surround these exciting seasons. Whose table will you be at for Thanksgiving dinner? How many Christmas parties will you attend? Will you open the presents on Christmas day or Christmas eve? Our family is developing our own holiday traditions, but as we enter November, we are also exiting a season which for us has its own traditions. We refer to August-October as birthday season since six of our nine birthdays fall during these three months. And Charles didn't disappoint us as he came right in the midst of the busy birthday season.

Just a few years ago, early on the morning of her birthday Kari met me by the side of the bed asking, "when are we going to get my donut?" Our tradition, since Jonah was young, has been that on the morning of their birthday, each child gets to go out with dad for a birthday donut. I've known for a long time that the kids treasure this time and it's a big part of each of their birthday celebrations, but it was Kari's two questions in the car on the way home that day that made me realize how much of a beloved tradition this had become for them. After considering my reply, Kari countered with the following question, "Would it still be my birthday if I didn't get a donut?" I quickly responded, "it would, but it wouldn't be as special for me!" Kari responded just as quickly with a simple two words which I will not likely forget, "me either!"

My interaction with my daughter that morning made me realize how important routine and tradition are for her and her siblings. They each cherish the things that we do with and for them and especially those that they have come to love and appreciate over time. My hope is that they love and cherish the other important traditions that we share with them as well. Especially the time that we spend helping them to grow in the knowledge of their Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, the emphasis on being in worship as often as possible and the time spent at the foot of the cross, speaking with our God, who loves us more deeply than we could ever love one another.

In the same way, I pray that each of us would cherish the traditions of the church over the coming months. Opportunities abound to make Christ and His bride, the church, the center and focus of our life and celebrations. As the church year closes, we focus on the time when Christ will come again to raise us to new life. At Thanksgiving, we remember the giver of all good gifts, and praise Him for His faithfulness. During the season of Advent, we prepare for the incarnation of our Savior and at Christmas, we receive the greatest gift ever given as we celebrate of the birth of Christ. The Rev. Tyler and Yanela McMiller serve the Lord through The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) as missionaries in Eurasia, based in Italy. Tyler is the sole LCMS pastor in Italy, where he provides spiritual care for a number of Italians who discovered Lutheranism online and want to learn more. Tyler also mentors four Italian men who are studying to become pastors through an online Lutheran seminary based in Riga, Latvia, and he provides Word and Sacrament ministry to small groups of Lutherans scattered throughout Greece and Bulgaria. Through this work, Tyler's goal is to help geographically isolated believers establish house churches wherever they live.

The McMiller family will be with us at Emmanuel on November 14th to share the Word of God and to give us an update on their work in preparation for what the Lord has called them to do in Italy and throughout Europe. A free will offering will be taken to offset the cost of their travel to be with us and share about their exciting work.
